The Explorer Dome

Missing PE Kits

A gentle reminder - children should have a PE kit in school everyday. We are aware since Christmas many children have not yet brought their kit back into school. Teachers may insist that children can't join in with certain PE activities if they don't have the right clothing with them for health and safety reasons.

Leadership and management

The whole school team have been spending time looking at our curriculum and what it entails. The teachers all lead a particular area of the curriculum and this term we will be having a close look at each subject and how we see progression through the school. Within our curriculum we teach literacy, maths, science, computing, sports and physical exercise, music, Spanish, design technology, history, geography, religious education, arts, crafts and forest school. We also teach personal, social, cultural and health education which includes safety, mental health, British Values and sex and relationships. All of these polices can be viewed on our website.

Here are some statements that staff and governors agreed on together which may help explain a little of what we do in school:

What do we mean by 'Curriculum'?

Everything we do with the children at The Grove whilst they are with us is to inspire learning, develop the whole child and bring the National Curriculum to life.

We have a skills and knowledge based curriculum.

Knowledge and skills are intertwined. Children need knowledge to apply the skills they acquire. The acquisition of skills is at the heart of learning and are the tools to access learning. We aim to provide children with skills they need for life and to develop transferable skills and a thirst for lifelong learning.

What is performance and how do we measure it?

Performance is a measure of how far a child is progressing against their individual learning pathway. Assessments against performance are based on a personalised planned education for each child and against national standardised criteria.

What do we see as progression?

Progress is the way that knowledge, skills and understanding are built upon in an individual, developmental and structured way like rungs on a ladder. Our curriculum through the school is progressive up the ladder ensuring that gaps in learning are quickly filled and reinforced. We design learning so it is inclusive for all and builds on individuals' prior knowledge, skills, emotions, character and confidence. Our progressive curriculum ensures that there is a notable difference in abilities, skills and knowledge within each subject area as the children get older.

What is data and what do we use it for?

Data is the way that progress and performance are measured. It is used in a cyclical method to inform teaching and learning and facilitate children fulfilling their potentials. It also gives measurements that can be used against national data to help us evaluate how successful our curriculum is and where it may be useful to strengthen it further.
