The Governors and Leadership of the school

The Full Governing Body met on Tuesday morning where we looked at our great school results from last year and what we could do even better, class structure for 2017, reports from the committees and received a very informative presentation about Forest Schools from Mr Brudenell.

This term we have achieved a great deal on our school improvement plan including making changes to how we teach Early Years under our new Early Years leader Miss Clark. We have also been very successful in narrowing any gender gaps in achievement through the school and will continue to keep this as a focus, for example boys traditionally do less well in reading and writing and better in Maths and Science than girls. We have begun to launch our 'eschools learning platform' which some classes are starting to familiarise themselves with. The remaining items from the term's school improvement plans are to improve children's attendance which still is falling below national figures and to work on producing a half yearly report on how the school is doing for parents, I will be working on this for the new year. We welcome any input on either of these two areas.
