What's happening this week and next

The Elizabethan opening Ceremony took place on Tuesday Ist May and Year 5 wore their Elizabethan costumes and danced to Elizabethan music. They were a real credit to the school. We also received the 'Rendall Crang' cup for raising the most poppy money at school. We raised £388.00. Club confirmations have gone out and all clubs start next week.

Home learning review

Thank you for being patient with us whilst we trialled new home learning systems. We have been reviewing the amount of home learning taking place as well as children's and parent's comments to staff.

In Early Years, it was noted that not many parents manage to read with their children on a daily basis. If possible could parents aim for 4 times a week as a minimum – it does make all the difference. The children who are reading this much have made increased progress with their reading and have really benefitted. Parents seem to respond well to Tapestry and activities suggested.

In Key Stage I (Years I and 2) the amount of children completing home learning has stayed much the same (about 50%), parents seem to be able to access the home learning and appreciate the more educational type home learning suggested. This new system will remain the same.

In Years 3 and 4 home learning has declined and parents have not liked the change so this will return to weekly spellings and weekly home learning suggested.

In Year 5 half-termly set home learning with dated tasks have been used and this does seem to have worked well so will continue.

In Year 6 home learning is set weekly and this will continue.

If you would like to offer any further comments or suggestions please let us know as we are continuously reviewing our practices to ensure we offer the best education possible.

Basketball League

Last Wednesday three teams from The Grove, played in the first of two fixtures in the Totnes Learning Community Basketball League. The teams played very enthusiastically and after the first meeting they finished in third and joint fifth place, with only 4 points difference. We look forward to a tightly fought second meeting next week!

The course was challenging, running along the tracks in the forest, there were over eighty competitors in each race, from over twenty schools. The year three and four teams ran, I 200m and the year five and six ran I 600m.

All runners were brilliant and really supportive of each other, it is wonderful, to see their sportsmanship. The year three / four team finished in second place overall, which is a fantastic result with so many other schools competing. Well done to all the runners, many of them finishing in the top twenty in their race, well done.

The children were super and really got into character, and much fun was had by all. They were an absolute credit to The Grove school.
