Times tables - guidance for helping at home

Times tables are taught slightly differently to the method many parents are used to so please note these changes to help your children with their learning. The language has changed to make more sense mathematically and it really does seem to work! For slightly older generations it may feel a little backward but for the children it makes sense so please try to break the habit of a life time and help your children learn their times tables using this format:

Use the language: 'Three, four times' or 'three multiplied 4 times' which would be written '3X4' and look like this '111 111 111'

So in the tables

3x1=3 is three, one time or three multiplied one time

3x2=6 is three, two times or three multiplied two times

3x3=9 is ...


Etc.

Rather than the old method of Ix,2x,3x you put the number to be multiplied first in the number sentence and don't use 'one times three equals', 'two times three equals' sentences. Please see your class teacher if you have any questions.

News from the Governors

The Governing Board had its first meeting of the school year last week. We spent most of the time looking forward, planning our activities for the year.

We assigned roles and responsibilities and started to plan our monitoring visits for key areas of the school including maths, writing and SEN. We will also be reviewing a number of school policies during this term, these need to be updated on a regular basis. We have also set up a group that will be looking at longer-term strategy over a three to five-year period.

We did look back at our Safeguarding audit from last term, which confirmed that The Grove is a safe and happy environment for our pupils. Safeguarding will continue to be a priority for the school.

The financial situation is still very tight this year and we cannot provide all the staffing or resources we would want to support the children's learning. However, we have agreed to additional Teaching Assistant support for our reception area.

Laura Partridge has resigned as Vice Chair due to pressure of work, and we thank her for her time in this role. She will continue to be part of the governing body.
