The festival was well attended by children from Landscope, Berry Pomeroy and South Brent.





### **Key Stage 1 Sports Hall Athletics Competition**

More history was made this year as we rolled out a competitive sports structure for the youngest members of our learning community for the first time and they resoundingly proved they were ready for it! Teams of 8 came to the Sports Hall at KEVICC to compete in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and final KS1 competition of the year on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May in a variety of athletic events including team jump, team speed bounce, shuttle throw and many others. The grand finale of a parlauff relay was a great way to finish. In the end the Grove were winners and all students who took part went home with a medal and certificate for their efforts.



### **KS2 Athletics Festivals**

On Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> May and Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> May the KEVICC Year 10 Sports Leaders organised two Athletics Festivals. The Festivals were attended by a combined 380 Primary School pupils from South Brent, Landscope, Diptford, Harbertonford, Totnes St Johns and The Grove in glorious sunshine. The festival was held on Redworth Field at KEVICC and the Sports Leaders led activities which enabled the participants to work on each of the athletic disciplines of running, jumping and throwing. Each individual workshop lasted for 15 minutes then pupils rotated around so they could have a go at all of them. Primary students were awarded stickers for a variety of positive attributes that they had shown throughout the day including knowledge, demonstrating skills, helping others, showing Olympic values and effort.





### **Athletics Competitions**

This year's team athletics competitions were held on the Redworth Athletics track at KEVICC on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June for Year 3/4 and Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> June for Year 5/6. Teams of 8 which included 4 boys and 4 girls competed in a series of events to try and score as many points as possible. Every team member had a go at all 8 events and their individual score was added up to give a team score. The track events included a team sprint, a 5 minute run and relay. The field events included long jump, quadruple jump, javelin and chest throw. The team who accumulated the most points would be crowned the champions.



## Athletics Partnership Finals

On Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> June qualifying teams from across the SSP arrived at Forches Cross to participate in the Athletics Partnerships Finals. The competition consisted of 7 different events and a competitive relay in a year 3/4 and a year 5/6 age categories. The events ranged from a team sprint, standing long jump, turbo javelin, 5 strides, speed bounce, 5 minute run and 1 handed push throw. Going into the final relays there was everything to race for with both age groups having a mere 10 points between 1<sup>st</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> positions! Well done to The Grove who came runners up for Year 3/4!
