What is happening this week and next

Adding up your hours for the Children's University Scheme

We're really enjoying being part of the Children's University scheme. For all those who have signed up, hopefully it's inspiring you to become lifelong learners. Remember, you can sign up any time for the scheme. Just see Rebecca for a sign-up letter. There's been a bit of confusion over how to add up the hours you've been accruing. Plymouth University has this guidance which we can follow from now on...

Students can claim for I hour (I stamp), per week, per activity / club.

E.g. If a student attends 5 hours of swimming lessons, they can only claim for one of those hours each week. However, if they attend 1 hour each of swimming, dance, science, music and chess clubs, they can have a stamp for each of these activities, which makes a total of 5 stamps for the week. This was put in place by Central Children's University and is to encourage students to take part in as many different activities as possible.

If you go to Saltram House and do two different activities, that also still counts for two stamps. Equally, a 6 hour multi-activity day would get you 6 stamps. We think we've got our heads around this rule, but if you have any questions please do ask Mr Gude or Miss Fernyhough.

Dementia Friends - Helping to create dementia friendly communities


Dementia Friends is an Alzheimer's Society led initiative which aims to increase dementia awareness and change the way the nation thinks, talks and acts about dementia.
