What's happening in the school this week and next

The children's Child Assault Prevention CAP workshops ran this week and have been exceptionally well received by all the year groups. The sessions were pitched particularly well and the children have learnt so much about how to look after themselves. Thank you again for the PTA funding this. Snowbell Tree class have started their swimming lessons. Sam Lyndon is in this half term and is working with various classes teaching and playing Handball which part of school sports partnerships.

Flame Tree Class

Year 5 are now coming towards the end of their topic all about Ancient Greece. We have been writing myths, creating lego water wheels, designing, making and testing Greek boats, learning about Greek inventions and creating pieces of art. Today we have had a day of mosaic making, creating mythological creatures, learning about Ancient Greek Gods and much more. To top it all off we have made and enjoyed a delicious Greek Banquet (as part of the children's cooking contributions) consisting of Greek Gazapacho, Greek Salad, Keftedes and Greek Yoghurt Pancakes. Caring Town Totnes Job Vacancy

Caring Town Totnes are looking for 2 warm, friendly and organised people (the Connectors) to staff a new Caring Town Information Service on a part-time job-share basis, for a total of 20 hours per week. This fixed term self-employed contract will be for an initial 5 month period from February to June 2017 inclusive, based in central Totnes. The rate will be £11 per hour and some Saturday hours will be required. Training will be provided. The Caring Town Information Service (CTIS) aims to connect local people who have questions or needs, to the most appropriate local services, groups or activities related to health, welfare and well being. This initial period is one of set-up and learning, and flexibility will be required.
