Class restructure September 2017

Thank you so much for the feedback we are getting. We will publish the feedback themes in a couple of weeks. The general big question for Year I and 2 seems to be whether we plan to completely mix up the children in their year groups. This is not planned but there is a chance to make slight adjustments where children haven't gelled. If you would like us to consider this for your child, please let us know. The other main question is around Year 6 still being able to do all their Year 6 special things as a single year. This will happen, residential will be for Year 6 only, as will the sleepover for Year 5, and Year 6 will finish their year with their performance.

The leadership team have been rewriting the school improvement plan taking us into the new financial year.

The Governing body

The governing body had two constructive meetings last week. The Resources Committee looked at capital expenditure and agreed to replace the back gate and tarmac the drive, making a more attractive and safer entrance. This committee and the Teaching & Learning Committee discussed the benefits and any issues around the proposed class structure. The final decision on the class structure will be taken by the Full Governing Body. The Teaching & Learning committee also discussed how to improve attendance, school educational visits, and arranged governor monitoring visits to a number of different areas in the school. These visits enable the governors to have a good understanding of the school and to monitor areas where the school is aiming to be even better. The governors are also working hard with the school to ensure the website is easier to navigate and is kept up to date.

Ginkgo Tree Class Dartmoor Trip
