We welcomed a new governor to the board at this week's meeting, Jenny Barker, and also confirmed Rob's new term. Great stuff. Just a reminder that you can find out more on the role of the board, and who we are, on the governor pages of school website.

The resources committee met last week to monitor the budget as we approach the end of the financial year, and our thanks again go to Hilary and Sandie for managing the budget so well in what is a constantly changing framework and set of pressures. As I have mentioned previously, this means investments continue to be made to support the curriculum, in resources available to all children, and also in development opportunities for staff. Approval of the budget was recommended by the resources committee and agreed on Tuesday by the full board.

In addition to the more procedural items, we also discussed staff and pupil wellbeing and the continued support available, and heard how the Primary Partnership of nine local schools is developing. This partnership gives the opportunity to share experiences and offer support and through reciprocated visits with peer groups across the schools' staff. And finally, we have started to look at ways to increase parent engagement - as a starting point we will use the themes raised from last year's parent and carers survey, and will let you know what format this will take and how you can contribute.
