REMINDER

What have the Leadership and Management been doing this half term?

After the pretty horrific COVID year the SLT, Key Stage Leaders and Special Needs leads have taken such pleasure this term in getting back into the classrooms to check on the quality of teaching and learning. I know it is very hard for you all at a distance not being able to see inside our school but the atmosphere in all the classes is just lovely – such positivity and enjoyment in which children can progress without added stress. We have been working on ensuring that all of our systems are consistent and well used throughout the school, that behaviour management is effective and that we know where all your children are currently and what they may have missed over the last year. We have had a firm focus on social skills and relationships as well as building on our pre-Easter focus of mental health.
