What's happening in school this week and next

The children are all really busy rehearsing for shows, there is a lot of singing and dancing taking place in the hall and studio. On Monday after school some children went to the Dart Hockey League which is being held at KEVICC. Tonight there is a Tag Rugby competition. It is being held at KEVICC Astro for Years 3 and 4 between 4-5.30pm. Key stage I and 2 have continued with their cooking. So far children have made porridge, flapjacks, shortbread biscuits and hedgehog shaped bread rolls and courgette cake. There are lots of lovely smells coming from the little kitchen. Key stage 2 tend to do more home cooking and planning skills of whole meals so will generally have cooking projects on the go rather than weekly sessions.

Leadership and Management

We are currently in the first week of a fortnight of assessment weeks when teachers carry out more formal assessments to enhance their Teacher Assessments. Teachers all then meet with me (the Headteacher), Mrs Wilkinson (the deputy head) and Ali Stewart (the special needs coordinator) to discuss every single child and their attainment and progress against the national curriculum. We gain an overview of all of your children but also contribute to any provision they require to support their learning and development. First, we are in the process of getting the messy area by the back gate cleared and set up for more on-site forest school activities. We are really excited to make a long term change to the school in this way. We are also going to fund CAP (Child Assault Prevention), to do workshops with all of the children and the parents. They are a local organisation who have been going for years, they will cover child protection issues but also Cyber protection for children, bullying on mobile phones and a parent workshop for parents to talk about any concerns. This variety do not drop needles. These trees are locally grown and will be freshly cut. The PTA also need to start collecting used toys and books for the Christmas Fair. There will be boxes in the classrooms or by reception for you to put your donations in. Also, they need volunteers to help on the day, with setting up, packing up, manning stalls if required.
