That's why I have started a petition asking South Hams District Council to declare a climate emergency, like Totnes, Teignbridge, Dartington, Devon County and Parliament have already done. This entails setting ambitious targets to become carbon neutral, calling on Westminster to provide the resources to deliver those targets, and to report to full council within 6 months with an action plan detailing how these targets will be met.
