Dear Parents and Carers,

Parent Feedback from Lockdown

We have had almost all parents get back to us now - please send us your feedback this week - it is so important for us to prepare for your child for September.

To ensure we are fully ready to support your children in returning to school in September we need time to adapt the curriculum and develop our knowledge of mental health strategies and physically put the school back together.

The staff will hand over all information about your children to the next staff group during these final INSET days so please be assured that the new staff will be fully aware of your child and their needs. On top of this, because for the most part we haven't seen your children since Lockdown, we would really appreciate you emailing me at head@the-grove-primary.devon.sch.uk to tell us about your child's current needs and the effects of lock down.

If you could let me know these things below and I will ensure all the information is passed onto the correct new class team (including secondary school transfers for year 6):

- child's name and current class name or teacher and year group
- are there areas about your child's education that you are concerned about?
- are there areas of your child's education that you are encouraged by?
- do you have any concerns about your child's mental health caused by lockdown or other recent factors?
- Is there anything COVID related that has effected your family that you would like the school to know.
- is there anything you would like us to know that would help resettle your child into school

September Return

The guidance for September came out last Thursday and we have been working on the logistics and details, but we aren't quite there yet. Once we have them and DCC have provided a new risk assessment we will send you the plans.

In basic terms this is what we know for sure so far:

Each class will be a bubble and we will be doing our very best to keep each bubble separate. This then reduces the contamination risk to one class and the adults connected to that class of children. Reception will be a bubble of the whole Acorn unit.

The bits that will really affect you as parents will be drop off and pick up as you won't be able to enter the school building. We will provide times for each class and an entrance to use - we are trying to keep them as close to normal hours for you as possible. For Reception, Year I and Year 2 one parent will be able to come onto the school field to aid drop off, but social distancing must be maintained. As there will be a strict timetable to ensure all 323 children can arrive and leave school safely we would also ask parents to drop off/pick up their children and

leave the school site as promptly as possible. Only one parent to come to school and any pre-school children should be either in a buggy or have their hand held by you. We are working on ways to ensure siblings can be dropped off and picked up together. It would be good to start coaching your children about how to leave you there, as this might be tricky for some.

We will be back in school uniform but it will need to be washed regularly. We won't be able to send reading books home but we will invest in a good online reading resource for you to use at home.

Communication with staff will have to continue through email and phone calls please (sorry - this is all so alien to what we are all used to).

What we also know for sure is that this is going to be quite tricky for all of us until we get into a routine, so your patience is always gratefully received. Our top priority will be making your children feel safe, secure and comfortable within school, so they can thrive and as a consequence learning can take place. We have always prided ourselves in the school's warmth and despite working in different circumstances our staff will ensure this is still maintained.

Please continue sending me on head@the-grove-primary.devon.sch.uk the feedback about your children and that will help us prepare to receive them in September. Any anxieties are useful for us to know as we are trying to put together a pastoral care package currently that won't compromise the bubbles.
